



Hospice Home at High Point

Hospice Home at High Point is an 18-bed inpatient facility providing terminally-ill patients with state-of-the-art hospice care in a comfortable, home-like setting. Hospice Home offers optimum medical care around-the-clock, seven days a week.

While the majority of hospice care is provided at home, there are times when patients may need more medical supervision or perhaps more personal care:

General inpatient care is for patients who require frequent skilled nursing intervention for management of symptoms (including pain, respiratory distress, increased agitation and confusion, and uncontrolled nausea and vomiting), or continuous monitoring. Once the symptom is controlled, the patient may return home or be eligible for residential care. (Respite care to provide relief for caregivers may also be available.)

Residential care is appropriate for more medically stable patients who have a prognosis of weeks or less and require more assistance than is available in their home setting.



Every patient has a private room with bath and an individual patio opening onto a garden area. A family kitchen along with living and dining areas, solace room, and sunrooms are also available to friends and families.

Hospice Home offers open visitation for family and close friends. The goal of Hospice care is to make the patient feel more comfortable, more at peace, and more in control.



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The hospice approach to care at Hospice Home includes an interdisciplinary team of highly trained professionals working together with the patient and family to develop a plan of care. The team includes registered nurses and nursing assistants as well as a medical social worker, chaplains, grief counselors, therapists, dietician and trained patient/family volunteers as needed. Patients may choose to have their primary physician or the Hospice medical director direct their care.

Medicare and Medicaid cover in full the cost of general inpatient and respite care for eligible patients, but only cover the medical care portion of residential care. At the residential level of care, patients are assessed a daily charge for room and board. Patients may apply for a Hospice care subsidy which funds all or a portion of the room and board charges. Many commercial insurance plans cover at least some of the charges for each level of care. Our referral team assists each patient and family to determine available coverage and eligibility for our care subsidies.

Hospice of the Piedmont's referral team is always available to assist families and medical professionals with evaluating appropriate care options. Patients referred to Hospice Home are given priority according to need and their condition rather than time on the referral list.
