is now complete.

The merger between Hospice of the Piedmont and Hospice of Randolph is now complete. Since announcing their intent to merge in April 2019, both boards and leadership teams worked diligently to ensure that the joint collaboration would result in a solid, mission-driven organization with a continuing common commitment to patients, families, staff and community. The formal merger was completed on October 1.

Led by former Hospice of the Piedmont President and CEO Trent Cockerham, the agency will operate two campuses and inpatient facilities, Hospice Home at High Point and the Randolph Hospice House. Hospice of Randolph will operate as an affiliate of Hospice of the Piedmont while maintaining its strong position as a healthcare provider in Randolph County.

## Gifts of Hope and Help for the Holidays

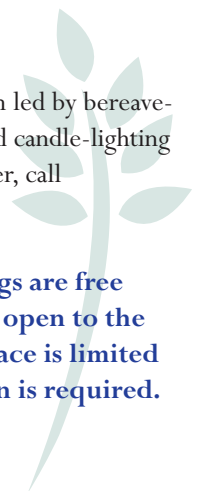

### GIVING AND GETTING

"I get more out of volunteering than I feel like I give." This sentiment is one Ryan Biagini and Dawn Stone hear over and over. As volunteer coordinators, Ryan and Dawn help train and schedule volunteers to spend time with hospice patients and their families. Often, volunteers enter their first assignment nervous, but soon learn like so many others, that volunteering is a rewarding gift not only to others, but to themselves.

Volunteers play an important role in the hospice team in a variety of capacities. Patient/family volunteers interact with patients and families, making home visits, visiting those living in assisted living or skilled nursing facilities, or visiting with patients at Hospice Home at High Point or the Randolph Hospice House. Some volunteers help with transportation and getting patients to necessary appointments or take care of essential business. Other volunteers provide clerical support like filing, assembling patient handbooks, or answering the phone and greeting visitors at the inpatient facilities. Regardless of their function, volunteers are essential.

You can learn more about volunteering for Hospice of the Piedmont and Hospice of Randolph by attending the Volunteer Information Session on Tuesday, October 22 from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Hospice of the Piedmont office, 1801 Westchester Drive in High Point. If you are interested in becoming a Hospice volunteer after completing the session, our next required training will be held on Monday, November 4 (8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.) and Wednesday, November 6 (12-4:30 p.m.) in High Point. Application and pre-training interview are required.

They assist with special recognition ceremonies in which a veteran patient is presented a pin and certificate of appreciation for their military service. Often veteran patients face issues at the end of life which may be related to their military service.
